# College plans study tour of Spanish cities in May

Colby Community College is offering a college study tour to Barcelona and Madrid, Spain, in May

Participants will explore two of Spain's most enchanting cities on the 11-day tour, led by Vice President of Student Services Keegan Nichols. The tour is open to everyone. Departure is Tuesday, May 22, with the return trip on Friday, June 1.

"This is a wonderful opportunity to visit Spain with all the planning, travel and other arrangements completed by CCC and EF College Study Tours," said Dr. Nichols. "Participants will see some of the world's most impressive sculptures and paintings, including Las Meninas by Velazquez at the Prado

The tour cost of \$2,886 includes round-trip air fare from Denver to Barcelona, bus transfers and highspeed train tickets. There are nine overnight stays in hotels with private bathrooms. Breakfast is provided daily and three dinners are included in the tour www.efcollegestudy tours.com.

Nichols says there will be a meeting to discuss details at 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 23, in the Fireside Lounge of the college's student union.






