"I started painting with pastels when my kids were young,' said Reilley. "It is a great medium to use with small kids around because you can set the pastels down without any cleaning of brushes. My working area would be exactly as I left it, with no drying of paints on the canvas like other mediums."

Reilley explained that pastels are commonly confused with chalk; they are not. They are pure pigment and are the base ingredient used in oils and watercolors so painting with them is like using paints without the liquid. It is a very permanent medium and the colors do not change over time, like they would in oils and watercolors.
