1. Win the heart with the ace and discard the ace of spades on it! Then play the K-Q of spades,
discarding two clubs. There is a 93 percent chance of the opposing spades dividing either 4-3 or 5-2, which.
It would be wrong to play the ace of hearts at trick one and discard a club, leaving you to rely
on either a successful club finesse or on the hope that cashing the A-K of clubs at some later stage would drop the queen. At best this would give you about a 50 percent chance for the contract.
2. It would be a mistake to win the spade lead 2. It would be a mistake to win the spade lead
with the ace, cash the king of diamonds, then cross to dummy's king of spades in the hope of would amount to staking the outcome solely on a favorable diamond division. While it is true that the diamonds are likely to be divided 3-2, there is
no need to put all your eggs in this one basket. A better method of play is to win with the ace of spades, lead the king of diamonds and overtake it with dummy's ace! Then cash the queen of
