She thinks therapy's slow

Dear Dr. Brothers: My cousin and I have always been close and found ourselves dealing with toxic work situations. We both were upset enough to go to therapists. But after a year and a half, we have had different results. She is still talking about feelings and is obsessed with a manager in her office who is "out to get her." I didn't want to talk about my feelings because it didn't help get anything changed, so I quit the therapist and my job and am rebuilding my career. I want my cousin to quit talking and do something! – P.V.

Dear P.V.: Although you are looking at the parallels in your lives, you and your cousin could have quite different things going on. The fact that you are different people, despite closeness, means you shouldn't expect her to have the same reactions to therapy you had. Add in two therapists, and you have so many different elements you should step back and rethink your conclusion that she should just quit her therapy and her job.

Obviously, if you got anything out of your sessions it was the realization that you had to pull back from the emotional response to your job issues and make a plan of action. That was right for you. Your cousin may be in a different place, overwhelmed by fears, insecurities, anger or feelings. She has to deal with a particular individual and may have other reasons to stay at the job. I think by being a good example of what can be done if you step up and cut the cord, she will see that perhaps she can follow in your footsteps. Set that example, but try not to judge her.




Famous Hand

Even the best players occasionally stumble in basic situations. Consider this deal played by Brazil and Norway during the 1970 world team championship.

At the first table, West led a club against four hearts, and the Brazilian declarer won East's queen with the ace. South played the ten of hearts at trick two, West contributing the seven and dummy the deuce as East won with the king.

East returned the nine of spades, South's queen losing to the king. West's jack of spades dislodged the ace, and declarer led a second trump. West rose with the ace and cashed the ten of spades to set the contract. At the second table, with Norway North-South,
