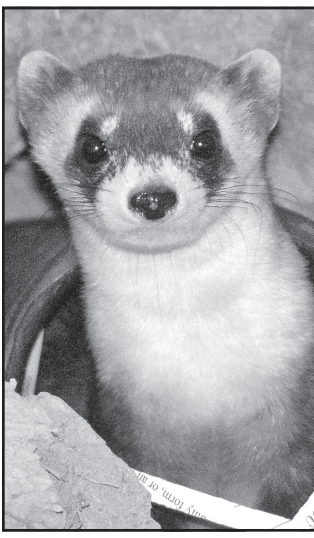

Sheriff to install cameras in vehicles

will back up data automatically to a hard drive and will have the ability to burn DVDs straight away.

"All right, now how much is it going to cost and who has the money?" asked commissioner Paul Steele.

The sheriff's department representatives explained they have been lucky enough to gain access to low-cost equipment and installation using a bid obtained by Kansas Highway Patrol from Mobile Vision in Denver. Equipment, installation, GPS capabilities and extended warranty costs for five patrol vehicles totals \$25,437.50.

County Attorney Kevin Berens explained to commissioners that because the bidding process has already taken place at the state level, a repeat is not required at the local level since the winning bid will be commissioned for Thomas County use.

Berens said he made a commitment to the sheriff's department, that if approved, he would provide up to 50 percent of funding from the Diversion Fund because, as Finley explained, "when we can provide such high-quality evidence, it makes prosecution so much easier."

The remaining \$12,718.75 will be paid for from the Special Reserve Equipment Fund.

Researchers looking at mammoth bones

The group helped unearth six rib bones, a lower leg bone and a scapula, or shoulder blade, Ray said. The bones will undergo carbon dating at the university before they are sent to a museum in Denver.

About 50 yards away, the crew also found artifacts of flakes where these early Americans may have sharpened knives or made spear points, Ray said.

Continued research may shed light on whether the bones and the artifacts are connected and whether hu-

mans killed the animal, Ray said.

There are some signs that could lead toward the latter, including that the artifacts were found nearby and that the two sites were buried at the same depth. The bones were also found in the uplands instead of the lowlands near a creek or water body, a typical place a mammoth might die.

"That kind of suggests there were humans nearby and that they might have been camped nearby," Ray said. "That is just a possibility."

He said researchers plan to return next year to gather more information.

Firm reminds public to call 811 before digging

Morris, president and chief executive officer of Southern Star. "Everyone should also know about 811.

"Any homeowner, contractor, excavator, farmer, or other person who plans to dig anywhere on their property or someone else's property for any reason can call 811 and have all the utility lines on the property marked for free within about three business days. The call takes about five minutes but can save substantial dollars in property damage and eliminate unintentional interruption of utilities like gas, water, sewer, telephone, cable, and electric services. In the worst case, this simple five minute call can save a life."

Underground utility line depths vary and multiple lines may exist in one area. Even simple digging jobs like planting a new

bush can damage utility lines, disrupt services to an entire neighborhood, harm those who dig, and result in expensive fines and repair costs. Marked lines prevent these consequences.

"Calling 811 is quick and easy," said Morris. "You make one call a few days before you dig, answer questions like who you are, what type of digging will be done and where it will be done, then the 811 dispatcher calls all the underground utilities in your area."

Rob Carlton, vice president and chief compliance officer for Southern Star emphasized the importance of marking utilities every time digging occurs, even when speed is critical.

"We have employees and facilities in Joplin, Missouri," Carlton said. "Within hours after the devastating tornado struck and destroyed over 1/3 of Joplin this spring, we had personnel on the ground marking pipe-

lines. "The next day, we launched a comprehensive public awareness campaign and began meeting with rescue, recovery, and rebuilding groups because we knew these efforts might lead to workers and volunteers unintentionally digging into underground utilities and compounding problems. We advertised 811 Call Before You Dig on billboards and banners and gave out truck magnets and T-shirts to workers and volunteers."
