

A Colby man was killed Sunday night when his couver, Wash. He was uninjured, and had been wearsport utility vehicle was hit by a semi-trailer rig near ing his seatbelt. the Nebraska border.

According to the Kansas Highway Patrol report, Loren Turner, 85, was driving east on K-383 about 17 miles north of Phillipsburg in his 2011 Chevrolet Tahoe Sunday night. He was struck at the intersection with U.S. 183 by the other vehicle, a 2006 Volvo truck, as it attempted to turn onto K-383.

The truck driven by Andriy Yaremchuk, 30, of Van-

Turner was pronounced dead at 9:40 p.m. He was taken to Olliff-Boeve Memorial Chapel in Phillips-

burg. He had not been wearing his seatbelt. Turner, originally from Menlo, was a retired state employee from Colorado, where he worked at the Eisenhower Tunnel on I-70. He had moved to Colby in May to be closer to his family.
