Are you willing to become less?

Jesus said, "Among those born of woman there has not arisen anyone greater than John the Baptist.

The apostle John said this about John the Baptist, "He came for a witness of the Light, that all might believe through him. He was not the Light, but came that he might bear witness

The greatness of John the Baptist can be found in the fact that he understood and accepted that last statement. He knew who the Light was, and he knew it wasn't himself.

God's sovereign purpose for John was very clear and simple. He was created to point men and women to the dawning light, and then like the morning mist to be burnt away by the greater glory of the rising Son. John was content with that. Thus he could say, "He must increase, but I must decrease."

As he meditated on these things the 19th century hymn writer, Horatius Bonar, wrote:

"He must grow greater; I grow less and less; / I like the mist which o'er the mountain flies, / And in the rising glory vanishes; / He like the Sun in yon fair morning skies; / Amen, amen, I would not have it otherwise."

Note the phrase, "I would not have it otherwise." John could honestly say that. Can we?

We have been taught that our purpose in life is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever. But what if glorifying Him means that like the mist, we too must melt away, unseen and forgotten, so that the greater glory of God can become visible? If that is the way it must be would we really say, "Amen, amen, I would

not have it otherwise?

Some years ago I discussed these things with a young minister, one of the most spiritually gifted, multi-talented men I have ever known. He had only been in the ministry a short time when he began to see God bless in remarkable ways. His church was packed with people who wanted to hear him preach. People were responding to his messages and lives were being transformed. Revival was breaking out and God was using him. Overnight he was becoming a celebrity and as news of his success spread he began to be in demand as a special speaker.

But then problems began to develop. As a result the number of people coming to be ministered to by him dropped. Naturally, this was a discouraging time for my friend.

As we discussed the situation my friend said he would do anything he could to bring glory to God. Something - perhaps the Lord, perhaps my own orneriness – prompted me to ask, What if God wants to bring glory to Himself through your failure? Are you willing to be a failure for Him?"

Suddenly my friend got terribly quiet. Af-

ter about a minute he answered, "I don't think so." I appreciated his honesty.

You see, my friend liked being used by God and the glory that came as he pointed men to the Son, but he didn't like it when he realized that it might please God to melt his glory so the greater glory of the Lord might shine the

Sometime later a mutual friend told me this same young minister challenged him with this question: "What if God were never to use you again? What if He were to say, 'I've used you all I can, you've preached your last sermon, all I'm to use you for has been accomplished.' Would that be enough for you?'

That he would be asking these questions told me he had been wrestling with the issues we discussed. It also told me he was growing.

I am glad to say God has continued to use this man in wonderful ways. He is presently enjoying a successful ministry. But what is most exciting to me is that he has changed his goals. He no longer seeks mere success. He now is striving for true greatness, the kind of greatness John the Baptist displayed when he said, "He must increase, but I must decrease."

By the way, when I first published his story I called my friend to ask for his permission. He gave me permission to share it – and he wept.
