Do you boast about weaknesses?

I will not boast about myself, except about my weaknesses. Even if I should choose to boast, I would not be a fool, because I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain, so no one will think more of me than is warranted by what I do or say. I will boast all the more

gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses ... for when I am weak, then I am strong (2 Corinthians 5-6, 9b, 10b)

Imagine Sports Illustrated doing their annual swimsuit issue with out-of-shape, ugly women. Imagine someone advertising some exercise program using a 95-pound weakling as their main spokesman. Imagine a National Football League team drafting a guy in the first round who was a bench warmer in high school and college.

I'm sure the magazine's subscribers would flood the editors with their anger, the exercise program would not sell and the team would have had some very angry fans. (An NFL team actually drafted a handicapped former football player with their last draft choice of 2011, a very classy move.)

Would you listen to someone who boasted of his weakness? St. Paul boasted of his weakness. Why? Today's counselors would say that anyone who did that probably had a bad self-esteem or a bad relationship with a significant

But Paul did not have bad selfesteem. As for a bad relationship with a significant other, many theologians believe that Paul, because he was part of the Sanhedrin that required its members to be married, was divorced. If true, it tells me that he could teach about the importance of marriage not only from his knowledge of Scripture but also from the knowledge of the pain that divorce brings.

Actually Paul had very good self esteem – or better yet, he had Christ-esteem because when he was weak he considered himself strong – strong in the Lord Jesus, *yahoo*.

We are weaklings. Sin makes us so. Our sinful nature makes us so from our conception and we can't shake it no matter how hard we try. Every day we sin in thoughts, words and deeds. When we confess this and our sins we do it in confidence, that God will forgive us for Christ's sake. He doesn't let us down. Forgiveness through the Lord Jesus Christ makes for strong people.

When it comes to good works, we're weaklings. Isaiah tells us that all our good works are like filthy rags. Our sinful nature taints even the good things we do.

When we confess that our good works, no matter how much the world lauds them, cannot get us God's love and get us into heaven, then we can be confident that God does love us and that heaven is ours through Jesus. We can be strong in Jesus Christ who made that all possible by being weak on the cross from which he showed His mighty over sin, death and the devil in His resurrection.

Through faith Christ lives in us. motivates us and blesses us to do good works that benefit our neighbors and his kingdom. It's a faith relationship that gives us a good esteem, a Christ-esteem.

What weaknesses do you have? Lift them up to the Lord, repenting of the sins and knowing that in Jesus you are forgiven. Then live free knowing that he will use you in this world in very powerful ways. He did it with Paul, he can do it with you. In Christ any weakness can be a strength.


