

Dear Dr. Brothers: I'm happily married, but recently I started working with an older man, whom I really admire. He's also taken a liking to me, and we work closely on a daily basis. Dear C.A.: The fact that you know you will not act on these feelings, and that you feel guilty for even thinking about it, signals you're probably not at real risk of having an affair. Before things progress further, you owe it to yourself to take a look at your marriage and identify whether there's something you're unsatisfied with, and then address those weak points. While there's no harm in fantasizing about a romantic tryst with someone other than your husband (married men and women do it all the time), you don't want to put yourself in the position that this ever might come true.


You should talk to your husband about anything you identify - whether it's his travel or something else – but spare him the details of your crush. Think about the level of honesty and communication you would want from him in a similar situation, and try to follow the golden rule: You don't want to do anything with this co-worker you wouldn't want your husband doing with another woman. If you can work through your problems, this crush will likely pass as easily as it came, and your marriage will be stronger for it.

There also are other, more active ways that you can teach your children to respect the environment and nature. One is by exposing them to natural environments, whether it's an after-school trip to a park or a weekend in the woods. You also can include your kids by planting a garden. Kids love getting dirty, and gardening can be a rewarding and meaningful way for your kids to interact with the natural world – especially if you can help them remember to water and care for their plants so they thrive. If you can identify an environmental issue your kids are interested in, take time to sit down and write a letter to your local congressperson or senator to show you care. 
