move forward with the transition," she said, "but it doesn't need to get done until the end of 2012 and even though it's pressing, the commissioners still have plenty of time to find a qualified candidate.

"I'm excited and hopeful that the perfect person will be hired, but I also understand it takes time and we are okay with waiting."

The commissioners said there are a number of entities in the county who will be partners with the new director and it is important that the relationships be positive and well-working from the beginning. Not only will the new director supervise a group of about 30 volunteers, he or she will also work closely with Thomas County commissioners, the Thomas County medical director Dr. Brewster Kellogg, hospital staff and various other medical professionals in the

The commissioners have already conducted several interviews and will make their final decision after getting recommendations. Christiansen and County Clerk Shelly Harms received phone calls from Jerry Cunningham, an investigator with the vices, who offered their expertise to help transfer from one state to another.

decide on the new hire.

"Jerry is hoping the commissioners will utilize their services because of the complexities of the profession," Harms said.

Bryant and the assistant director Don Morton said they also hope the commissioners will seek a recommendation from physician assistant Brian Unruh. They said Unruh is familiar with Emergency Medical Services and how they partner with Thomas County's entire medical community.

"It'll be good once we get through the stress of it all," Bryant said.

She said as soon as a director is hired, they can get registered for the new transitions, which are even more complex.

In a May 26, interview with the Kansas Health Institute, Steve Sutton, the interim executive director of the Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Services, said the change was one of the most significant since the services were formed in the 1970s. "This is changing how EMS functions,"

he said, "and trying for the first time to take a national approach to the way education is delivered and the tasks that attendants are expected to perform."

The new set of standards will make it Kansas Board of Emergency Medical Ser- easier for emergency medical technicians to

"It could potentially bring better care to the people we serve and a greater scope of abilities we are allowed to do for a patient," Bryant said. "But there is a catch."

Bryant explained that the simplest transition from a basic emergency medical technician to the new designation could take about 26 hours of classroom time. And it could take as many as 280 classroom hours to transition from a the basic technician to the advanced designation.

She also explained that there is a local protocol that Emergency Medical Services must follow which determines what they are specifically allowed to do within Thomas County. The local protocols are set and approved by the medical director and even after the mandatory transition training is completed, Bryant said it will ultimately be the decision of Dr. Kellogg to implement the new skills or not.

Bryant said there are a lot of factors that have to be taken into account before any decisions are made, and that the process to change local protocol may take time.

She said though, no decisions need to be made now since they have not yet started the transition and there is plenty of work that needs to be done before anybody is ready to


