


Original sauce: spaghetti legacy

HELOISE'S ORIGINAL ITALIAN SPAGHETTI SAUCE

1/4 cup olive oil

3 tablespoons finely chopped, fresh parsley

1/2 cup butter

- 1 cup finely chopped onions
- 1 pound ground beef 4 strips finely chopped bacon
- 4 cloves garlic, chopped fine
- 1 bay leaf, chopped fine 1 tablespoon salt
- Black pepper, freshly ground to taste
- 1 teaspoon crushed dry red pepper
- 2 ounces red wine 2 15-ounce cans of whole tomatoes or tomato
- sauce 1 small can tomato paste
- 1 cup water
- 1 finely chopped carrot (or grated Heloise, Heat olive oil over low heat in a large pot.

(Note: You will be adding all ingredients to this one pot). Add the butter and simmer until it melts. Add onions and sauté until light brown. Add the ground beef and bacon, and continue sautéing until browned. Be sure to stir occasionally. Add garlic, parsley, bay leaf, salt, black pepper

and red pepper. For 10 minutes, continue to cook over low heat. Add wine, cover and let sit for a

Add tomatoes or sauce, paste and water. Bring to boil. Add chopped carrot. Cover and cook for an hour, stirring occasionally over low heat. Now, cook up your favorite pasta, top and serve with this sauce. Enjoy! - Heloise



Solution to a Predicament There are all kinds of inferences a declarer can

draw from the bidding or early play of a hand. For example, consider this deal where South got to four spades on the bidding shown. West led the king of clubs, everyone following

low, and shifted to the queen of hearts. On this trick, declarer made the highly unusual move of playing low from both hands! As a result, South made the contract. West con-

tinued with a heart to the ace, and declarer drew two rounds of trumps, ending in dummy. He then discarded a diamond on the king of hearts and played the ace of diamonds followed by the queen. When East covered with the king, declarer

ruffed, returned to dummy with a trump, discarded a club on the jack of diamonds and in that way scored his 10th trick. The only tricks he lost were a heart and two clubs. Certainly South's method of play seems odd, since it appears more natural to win the heart

shift at trick two with the ace, draw trumps and take a diamond finesse. Had declarer adopted this course of play, though, he would have lost a diamond and three clubs and gone down one. Declarer's method of play was very wellfounded. He assumed from the first two plays that

West had the K-A of clubs and Q-J of hearts and was therefore not likely to have the king of diamonds also, given his original pass as dealer. So, rather than pin his hopes on West's holding

a card he couldn't have, declarer played East for


