Sometimes we wonder if God really hears us. I had an experience years ago that convinced me that he does.

I was in my last year of Bible college. I was supporting my wife and myself on the wages I received from a part-time job. Finances were tight. We were surviving on Campbell's soup, peanut butter, pasta and Hamburger Helper.

Shortly after Christmas a couple from the church were attending brought us a box full of groceries. On top of the box were two large steaks. Naturally, we were thrilled.

We put the groceries away and prepared one of our usual Hamburger Helper dinners for that evening's meal. Before we ate I said grace. My relevant part of my prayer went something like this: "Lord, we want to thank for the groceries, especially the steaks. It would have been nice if you had given us some potatoes to go with them, but I thank you for the steaks nevertheless." Believe it or not, I used to be a real smart-aleck.

The next night was our church's annual New Year's Eve soup supper, so we didn't use any of the groceries that night either.

Early the next morning my supervisor from work, Steve, stopped by. He told me that he was getting a crew together because his father's entire crop was in danger. He explained that his father had stored his crop in a rented warehouse. Unfortunately, the furnace had stopped working during the night.

He apologized for asking me to work on New Year's Day, but he was desperate. If the contents

of the warehouse weren't moved to another warehouse soon the entire crop would be lost. Steve's father's crop was potatoes.

The potatoes were sacked in 100-pound bags. They were stacked almost seven feet high. They filled the large storage unit.

Our job was to move these bags from one warehouse to another one about 50 feet away. It was freezing cold outside and the road between the warehouses was packed with ice.

Fortunately Steve had found some sleds. Unfortunately, he had not been able to find very many helpers. It took us most of the day to finish. It was backbreaking work; I have seldom been more exhausted.

At the end of the day Steve told us that he couldn't afford to pay us, but he did give each of us a 100-pound bag of the most beautiful potatoes I've ever seen. We had potatoes with our steak and pretty much everything else for the next month or so.

I took a number of lessons from this experience. First, God does indeed listen to us (ouch).

Second, He can provide potatoes to go with our steaks.

Third, He has a delightful sense of humor.

And, finally, God knows how to deal with a smart aleck.

Native Americans focus at Prairie Museum lunch

The Prairie Museum of Art and History kicks off its 2011-12 *Food for Thought* monthly program series at noon Thursday with a talk by Eunice Petramala of the Sand Creek Massacre National Monument.

Her topic, "The Settlement Period from a Native American Perspective," will be the first to explore the overall theme of High Plains settlement in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

Petramala has been a National Park Service Ranger at Sand Creek since 2007. She served as a Place and Native Voice intern at Bent's Old Fort National Historic Site near La Junta, Colo., in the summer of 2006.

With a combined Southern Cheyenne and Mexican heritage, she will bring a personal as well as professional voice to this topic.

Food for Thought programs are

offered at noon on the third Thursday of each month from November through April. A light lunch is served.

In light of the upcoming 150th anniversary of the Homestead Act, Pacific Railroad Act and creation of the Department of Agriculture - all of which played an important role in the eventual settlement of western Kansas - the current series will explore different aspects of the settlement period.

Future programs will focus on cattlemen and settler conflicts, railroads, black settlement, women homesteaders and Sod Town. There is no charge for these programs, though donations are gratefully accepted.
