Trojans basketball team gains 6-0 record after classic

The Colby Community College men's basketball team won all three of its games at the Ambassador Classic this weekend, held at the Community Building.

The Trojans started the tournament on a high note Thursday, blowing out Kansas State University-Salina with a score of 81-43.

Sophomore Carson Konrade, Spearville, led the Trojans' scoring efforts with 14 total points. He had 5 field goals out of 10 attempts, 2 three-point field goals, made 2 out of 2 free throws and finished the game with 5 rebounds and 3 steals.

This was just the beginning for Konrade, who increased his point total each night of the tourna-
