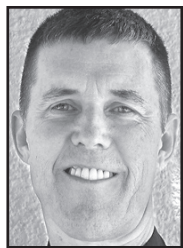
Visitation will be from 4 to 6 p.m. Sunday at the Yorgensen-Meloan-Londeen Funeral Home.

It seems that there is always something in life that can cause us anxiety. Bill found this to be true about his life, so after nights of losing sleep that bordered on insomnia, he decided to go to a counselor.

Counselor: "Bill, why you are having so much difficulty sleeping?"

Bill: "Because I'm trying to solve all the world's problems."

Counselor: "Ever get them solved?"

Bill: "Almost every time."

Counselor: "Then why can't you sleep?"

Bill: "The ticker-tape parades they hold for me keeps me awake."

If that was the only anxiety we experienced in life we would be blessed, wouldn't we?

Every Sunday the back page of our bulletin is full of prayer concerns. One hunk is for military people in combat zones. The majority of the other prayers concerns have to do with health, especially with the Big C - cancer.

All of us could say that if we had a personal bulletin, the back cover of it could be full of at least potential things to be concerned about, except they might be more appropriately called worries. Young people have a list of worries that may include popularity, acne, dating, school, pregnancy and divorce. An adult's anxiety list may include a rocky marriage, divorce, a rebellious teen, bills, job uncertainty, physical abuse, or drug/alcohol abuse. Single adults could add loneliness.

No matter who we are there's always something to be anxious about. It comes with the territory of living in a world marked by sin - our sinfulness and the sinfulness of other people.

St. Peter, writing under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, has some good words for us worry warts. You are blessed. You are blessed to be able to "Cast all your

anxiety on God." You are blessed to be under God's mighty hand.

The same mighty hand that created all that exists in six 24 hour days, spends each and every 24-hour day taking care of you. The same mighty hand that voluntarily took nails on a cross for you is always with you. The same mighty hand that "knit" in your mother's womb is preparing a place for you in heaven.

The same mighty hand that rolled the stone of the tomb away to come back to life lives to strengthen your faith and trust in Him through His mighty Word. The same mighty hand that died for sinners like you gives you the gifts of faith, repentance and forgiveness.
