The Lady Eagles finished last season with an outstanding 21-3 record and lost five seniors from last year's team. Katherine and Katrina Kaus, Caitlyn Wark, Kelsey Shields and Kayla Hockersmith all graduated in May.

Head Coach Parker McKee said that losing these girls has already affected his team this year.

"I think that it's really affected us more in practice because we're not able to have the competitive numbers," McKee said. "So we're having to find ways to be creative in practice to challenge those top seven kids."

The team has seven players that will be playing the majority of the minutes for the varsity: two seniors, four juniors and one sophomore. Colby has just one starter returning to the squad, but five other players are returning that didn't have large roles in terms of minutes played last season.

McKee said he's not sure what goals the Lady Eagles will have for the season, but they are focusing on making their team better for now.

'We've not sat down and talked about it, but we want to make sure that we're playing competitive all season and just develop our younger kids into better players," McKee said.

The Lady Eagles start their season today at the Hays City Shootout tournament and will play through Saturday. Their first home game will be at 6:15 p.m. next Thursday against Thomas More Prep-Marian High School at the Community Building.
