for things like education with less money coming in.

"What I've heard is that we're going to work to drop that down the road," he said, "not until we get this KPERS issue behind us. The proposal now is to go to more of a flat tax with two tiers.'

The Kansas Public Employees Retirement System has an estimated \$8.3 billion gap between expected revenues and the benefits promised on existing plans through 2033. Billinger said the current proposal is to move to a 401(k) style retirement fund for new employees, while current employees would keep their plans. The state will also likely be increasing its contributions and may ask for concessions from workers.

Another economic issue the state may

face is federal budget cuts. Mexico acknowledges Mayan 2012 reference

MEXICO CITY - Mexico's archaeology institute downplays theories that the ancient Mayas predicted some sort of apocalypse would occur in 2012, but last week it acknowledged that a second reference to the date exists on a carved fragment found at a southern Mexico ruin site.

Most experts had cited only one surviving reference to the date in Mayan glyphs, a stone tablet from the Tortuguero site in the Gulf coast state of Tabasco.

Arturo Mendez, a spokesman for the institute, said the fragment of inscription had been discovered years ago and has been subject to thorough study. It is not on display and is being kept in storage at the institute.

The brick date does coincide with the end of the 13th Baktun;

Baktuns were roughly 394-year periods and 13 was a significant, sacred number for the Mayas. The Mayan Long Count calendar begins in 3114 B.C., and the 13th Baktun ends around Dec. 21.2012.

But the date on the brick could also correspond to similar dates in the past, Stuart said.

> Both inscriptions - the Tortuguero tablet and the Comalcalco brick - were probably carved about 1,300 years ago and both are cryptic in some ways.

The Tortuguero inscription describes something that is supposed to occur in 2012 involving Bolon Yokte, a mysterious Mayan god associated with both war and creation.
