But it wasn't just peace with to live at peace. He taught us to "love our enemies and pray for those who despitefully use you." That's a radical departure from even the Jewish faith.

But Jesus said in Matthew 5:38-45. "You have heard that it was said, "Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth." But I tell you, Do not resist an evil person. If someone strikes you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also.... Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be sons of your Father in heaven."

This has implications for us as Christians that are as yet not fully understood. What is the role of the Christian in a secular world of war and woe? We are to be peacemakers: peace-bringers.

There can never be peace among men until first men find the peace within themselves that comes from peace with God. It is our responsibility as peacemakers to introduce men to peace with God. If men are at peace with God, they will have the peace of God also, and those two together will create peace among men.


