Boeing to leave Wichita

as being the “Air Capital of the World,” has a long history with Boeing. Brewer noted he worked for the firm for 20 years before the company sold off its commercial operations.

But the mayor said the city would move on and take care of those families and continue working to be the “air capital of the world.”

“This is not the first time we have had something of this magnitude. We have had other challenges and we have always managed to work through it...,” Brewer said.

Boeing has had a facility in Wichita since it bought the Stearman Aircraft Co. in 1929. During World War II, employment at the plant peaked at more than 40,000 as the company churned out four bombers a day. For decades the company remained the city’s largest employer.

Then in 2005, Boeing spun off its commercial aircraft operations in Kansas and Oklahoma. At that time, the company still had roughly 15,000 employees in Wichita. After the divestiture, Boeing retained 4,500 workers for its defense work in Wichita but layoffs since have slashed that remaining workforce.

The Wichita facility is facing the end of some programs, such as the international tanker program that supplied refueling tankers to other countries. Over the summer, Boeing announced it would cut 225 jobs at its Wichita defense plant through the end of this year.

Even with the loss of the defense plant, Boeing would continue to have an economic impact in this aircraft manufacturing city. Spirit AeroSystems, which took over Boeing’s commercial operations, continues to build parts here for Boeing’s commercial airplanes.

Class to teach adults how to spot, handle abuse of kids

cedures and building individual commitment to action with positive prevention plans.”

Campbell said that every adult should have a personal plan of what to do if they come to find or know a child who is being abused. By the end of the session, she said, participants should be able to understand warning signs and have the confidence to react.

“It is unrealistic to think that a young child can take responsibility for fending off sexual advances by an adult,” says Darkness to Light. “Adults are responsible for the safety of

children.

“Adults are the ones who need to prevent, recognize and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. Yet, the statistics clearly show that adults aren’t shouldering this responsibility. Darkness to Light believes that adults just don’t know how.”

Campbell said the national statistics show an estimated 42 million adult survivors of child sexual abuse in America today. Twenty percent of victims were under the age of 8.

A 2006 adult retrospective study from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found that one in four women and one in six men were sexually abused before age 18. Many incidents either have never been disclosed or adults failed to react properly.

Darkness to Light reports that of the cases made, 73 percent of child victims wait at least a year before telling someone and 45 percent wait at least five years.

Campbell said her office covers 11 counties, from Cheyenne to Trego, and in 2010, 694 cases of child abuse and neglect were reported. Of those, 141 of those were in Thomas County, which totals an estimated \$80,000 in immediate costs and more than \$824,000 in long-term effects for Thomas County alone. Six of those cases were substantiated.

“The financial and emotional impacts are huge, but are minuscule compared to how much it means if we can put an end to just one child’s suffering,” said Campbell. “Statistics show that more than 90 percent of abusers are people that children know, love or trust. We simply can’t allow this to happen here.”

Freeway closed near Colorado by wind, dust

Greene said the rig was traveling north on K-27 with an empty livestock trailer. The driver, from Holyoke, Colo., said he saw dust blowing across the road near the intersection with County Road 61 – about three miles south of Goodland. He said he slowed down as he approached the dust cloud, but a gust caught the trailer

and pulled the whole rig over onto the passenger side.

“The wind was pretty excessive,” Greene said.

Greene said the driver was not injured, and once the wind had died down, a tow truck from Alex’s Radiator & Auto Repair set the semi upright and brought it into town.

Greene said he had responded to the I-70 accident, but after a

few minutes, he was dispatched to the semi rollover.

In Goodland, the wind uprooted a hundred-year-old tree at Eighth Street and College Avenue. The tree fell against the roof of a nearby house. The wind also blew a section of roof off a house on Harrison Avenue. Part of the roof was blown over the top of the house and landed in the front yard. Insulation was

blown everywhere, even into nearby trees.

In Kanorado, a power pole blew down in the afternoon, causing outages throughout the day. In Tribune, about 60 miles south of Goodland, large limbs were torn off and metal sheds were damaged. North of Burlington, the side windows of a moving car shattered.
