Although applications may be taken at any time, only those applications submitted and ranked by that date will be considered for funding for the Fiscal Year 2012 program. The Conservation Service provides technical assistance for the program, which was reauthorized by the 2008 Farm Bill. For 2012, Kansas received an allocation of \$1.4 million.


