Hampshire strategy was its open Republican primary, which allowed independents to vote along with declared party members. He gambled that he could attract moderate voters, Republicans and independents alike, by presenting himself as a successful conservative leader who wasn't interested in engaging in a culture war.

He called his third-place showing a "ticket to ride" to South Carolina, but his distant finish behind Romney and runner-up Ron Paul was widely regarded as lackluster.

Huntsman, 51, was born in Redwood City, Calif., and raised in Utah. His father, an industrialist and at one time a Nixon administration official, founded Huntsman Chemical Corp. in 1982. Now the Huntsman Corp., it reported revenues of more than \$9 billion in 2010.

The younger Huntsman drifted a bit as a young man. He attended high school in Salt Lake City but dropped out to play keyboards in a band. He later attended the University of Utah, then dropped out to serve two years as a Mormon missionary in Taiwan, where he learned to speak Mandarin.

## Kansas liquor stores back state measure to allow tastings

TOPEKA(AP) – Some Kansas liquor store in trying unfamiliar beers, wines or distilled owners are hoping the Legislature makes it legal for them to hold tastings in which customers can sample certain products before

A measure introduced in the state Senate by several liquor marketing associations is the result of a controversy that emerged after retailers started arranging tastings near their

The *Topeka Capital-Journal* (http://bit. ly/Acm4ek) reports that because state law known to wine country enthusiasts. blocked consumption of alcoholic bevernearby. That stopped after representatives of the Kansas Department of Revenue issued a policy memorandum in August declaring the agency's interpretation of state law prohibited samplings, whether free or not, "in, on, or about the licensed premises."

The Senate measure would allow retailers to host in-store tastings for people interested or malt beverage.

Regulators concluded no tastings would be authorized for party or smoke shops, parking lots, sidewalks or alleys adjacent to liquor store property.

R.E. "Tuck" Duncan, a Statehouse lobbyist working with organizations seeking to get the bill passed, said the intent was to establish in state law the opportunity for liquor stores to host tastings similar to those well
