ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) – An 85-year-old Alaska woman used a grain shovel to fend off an agitated moose that was stomping her husband. George Murphy says his wife saved his life. The Anchorage Daily News (http://bit.ly/yahDtF) says the 82-year-old pilot, who flew for three decades for the Iditarod Trail Sled

Dog Race, was hiking with his golden retrievers near the Willow airport. He saw the moose and dove in the snow, but the moose started stomping him. His wife, Dorothea, who is 5 feet tall and weighs 97 pounds, grabbed a big shovel and hit the moose in the body and head. She ran for help; Murphy was rushed to Anchorage.

Highway Patrol begins hiring; class No. 51 will begin July 10

The Kansas Highway Patrol's Recruit Class No. 50 is going through the Training Academy now, and applications are being accepted for Class No. 51. This year marks the Highway Patrol's 75th anniversary. "We pride ourselves on providing professional and courteous services to the citizens of Kansas," said Captain Scott Harrington, commander of the patrol's public and governmental affairs section. Applications are being accepted through Friday, Feb. 24. Applicants will go through a written examination, physical agility test, polygraph exam, background investigation, interview, physical examination and psychiatric test. Recruits who are accepted will report to the Training Academy on Tuesday, July 10, for 22 weeks of training. The hiring process has been condensed to allow the class to begin this year, with applicants going

through a six-month hiring process, rather than the yearlong process that was in place previously. With retirements, promotions, and short-staffing in many areas of the state, these new troopers will come at a welcome time. 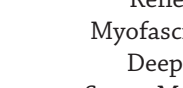
