Weishaar, a public relations major, has a 3.9 grade average. She is a team captain and has been communications chair of the Student-Athlete Advisory Council this year. She also helped lead a group of her teammates to volunteer in Joplin, Mo., following a devastating tornado last May.

Weishaar is a 2007 graduate of Lawrence High School. Her parents are Gary and Beth Weishaar of Lawrence and she has a brother, Derrick, 20, a sophomore majoring in graphic design and theatre production at K-State. Gary Weishaar graduated from Colby High in 1980.

The award is given to student-athletes who have lettered at least once in their sport and completed

at least one academic year at their school. The must have completed at least 100 earned credit hours with a cumulative grade average of 3.80 or higher.

Senior Bulldog sets record in substate game

Senior Cole Christensen led the Golden Plains High School varsity boys basketball team by scoring a career high 32 points and 21 rebounds along with 7 blocks in the Bulldogs' final game of the season.

The Bulldogs traveled to Sharon Springs Feb. 27 for the first round of the substate tournament to face the Wallace County Wildcats. The Wildcats had defeated the Bulldogs in early February, but the Bulldogs entered the game with determination.

"We were not ready to stop playing," Christensen said. "I knew this could be my last basketball game as a Bulldog. It was important to do my best in this game."

The team's determination was evident in the first quarter. Christensen put in 14 points, senior Ethan Walter scored a three and junior Andrew Luna sank a two to put the Bulldogs in the lead 19-17 at the end of the period.

After an early free throw from Christensen, the Bulldogs had difficulty scoring in the second quarter and the Wildcats pulled ahead for their first lead of the game.

Senior Kalyn Weber then tied the game back up with his first points.

Wallace County pulled back ahead only to have Christensen tie it back up. After that, the Bulldogs seemed to lose their momentum and the Wildcats took advantage and went into the half with a 37-24 lead.

Baskets from Weber, Luna and Christensen gave the Bulldogs 8 points in the third, but the Wildcats sank 18 points to extend their lead to 55-32. As Christensen did not want the season to end, he and Weber spent much of the fourth quarter on the free-throw line to help outscore the Wildcats 20-18.

The Wildcats' lead in the middle two quarters was enough to give them the 73-52 win and the right

to advance to the semifinals. Scoring for Golden Plains were Christensen with 32, Weber 11, Luna 4, Walter 3 and Tristan Schwarz 2.

This game ended the Bulldogs' basketball season with a final record of 3 wins and 18 losses, all three wins coming in January. Turnovers were numerous throughout the season, costing the boys the win in several close contests. With four seniors graduating, it will be up to the underclassmen to carry the load next year.

"We learned this season how essential teamwork is in this game," Luna said. "One person is not a team. We have discovered that fundamentals are important to achieve success and we have got to cut down on our turnovers next year."
