## Weather County hears way to save on plan

Commissioner Paul Steele said he wasn't sure they need one either.

Deputy Clerk Susan Guill said she has had issues with the current company's 90day period to turn in claims. She said many times, her providers wouldn't turn in claims in time, and she would have to pay the expenses out of her pocket.

Harms said if the commissioners decided to stick with a health reimbursement account, she suggests they go with Select Account. She said the firm doesn't charge a consulting fee. For about 65 employees that use the account, she said, the county would pay \$357.50 a month for a total of \$4,290 a year.

Harms said this would be an overall savings of \$10,474 for the county. She said the standard rate for this plan is \$4.50 per participant a month, and one of the benefits is that the company will deal directly with the employees' insurance companies rather than going through the employees and a subcontracting firm.

"There won't be any employees coming up to get a form so they can fax it in or questions," Harms said. "It alleviates (having) a second ... contracting company."

Currently, the employees have to file claims through Worksite Benefit Plans. Harms said that if the county switches to Select Account, it will eliminate the "middle man" and will be less of a hassle for the

Steele asked if they were going to run into a 90-day-period issue with this company and Harms said as far as she can see in the proposal, there are no conditions, but if the commissioners are interested in one of the companies, they will come to a meeting.

However, Harms told the commissioners what she thought they should do.

"Eliminate HRAs and look at your budgets for next year, and seriously consider reducing our deductibles back to \$500 or even \$1,000 and include family in there," she said. "We've got a lot of employees that work for Thomas County that are ... single parents that can't afford to pay the premiums out of their own pocket to cover health insurance for their children."

Thomas County Sheriff Rod Taylor said reducing the cost would help parents keep their kids on their plans until they're 26. Steele said he thinks that is important.

Harms told the commissioners to do some before the consultant meets with them.
