

Colby girls golfer signs with college

Kaylee Keck, a senior at Colby High School, signed a letter of intent Wednesday to play golf for Colby Community College.

Keck, a standout golfer for the Eagles, qualified for the state tournament three times during her high school career. She placed eighth at the girl's Class 4A State Tournament last fall at the Topeka Country Club.

The Lady Eagle golfers, coached by Rick Williams, were the Great Western Activities Conference league champions last year.

Miles Ladenburger is the head golf coach at the

college. He is assisted by Lisa Stithem.

"We are very excited to have Kaylee join our women's golf team," said Stithem. "She brings a lot of talent and experience with her. She will be a great competitor as well as a great fit for our team."

Keck participated in Junior Golf for eight years. She was a member of International Club and C-Club at Colby High and has been active in 4-H for 11 years.

She said she plans to major in business at the college. She is the daughter of Dave and Terri Keck of Colby.

Trojans softball team splits six games on road

The Colby Community College Lady Trojans softball team won three games and lost three on a six-game road trip to McCook, Liberal and North Platte, winning both games against McCook, losing two to Seward County and splitting with North Platte.

"We have played well in the last few games," said Coach Ryan Sturdy. "We weren't quite on our game against Seward, but I think we will be ready the next time we face them."

"The first half of the season has been mostly on the road, so it will be nice to place at home for a majority of the remainder...."

The Lady Trojans won 7-6 (in eight innings) and 12-11 against McCook last Wednesday.

The winning pitcher for game one was Michelle Glaze, who threw all eight innings, had 8 strikeouts and allowed 9 hits, 6 runs and 9 walks. The team made 5 errors.

The leading hitter was Kelsi Conway at 2 for 3, including a double, and 1 run batted in. She scored a run. The team had 9 hits.

In game two, Conway and Lori Harshbarger were on the mound for Colby.

Conway had 2 strikeouts and allowed 10 hits, 4 runs and no walks in a little more than four innings. The team made 4 errors behind her.

Harshbarger pitched for a little more than two innings with no

strikeouts and allowed 8 hits, 7 runs and no walks. There were 3 errors during her set.

Dominique Padilla led the team in hitting, going 4 for 5 with a double and 2 runs batted in. She scored one run. The team had 19 hits.

In conference games against Seward County on Thursday, Colby lost 8-0 and 12-4, both in five innings.

The losing pitcher for game one was Glaze, who threw two innings. She had 1 strikeout and allowed 7 hits, 7 runs and 4 walks. The team made 5 errors behind her.

Conway relieved Glaze and had no strikeouts and allowed 2 hits, 1 run and no walks. There was 1 error.

The women had no hits in the game.

The losing pitcher for game two was Conway, who threw for a little more than two innings. She had no strikeouts and allowed 9 hits, 10 runs and 2 walks with 3 errors.

Harshbarger relieved her. While she had no strikeouts, she allowed 3 hits, 2 runs and no walks. There were 2 more errors.

Deadra Trujillo went 2 for 3 at bat and accounted for 2 runs. The team had 5 hits.

The Lady Trojans finished the series by splitting with North Platte on Sunday. The Lady Trojans won the first game 6-4, but game two went to North Platte with a score of 3-1.

The winning pitcher and leading hitter was Glaze. She pitched all seven innings, posted 4 strikeouts and allowed 3 hits, 4 runs and 6 walks with 3 errors.

At the plate, she went 2 for 4, including a home run, brought in 1 run and scored another herself. The team had 7 hits.

In the second game, the losing pitcher was Ashley Archer, who threw the whole game. She had 3 strikeouts and allowed 7 hits, 3 runs and no walks.

Once again, Trujillo led in hitting with 2 of 3 hits. Colby had 6 hits.

"We are 3-3 at home on the season and seem to have more energy when we play in front of our home crowd," Sturdy said. "We are still having some ups and downs, but it isn't the time to peak yet."

"We need to start putting it together and get on a roll here in April to take momentum into the region tournament in about four weeks. We just need to get over the hump and break the streak."

The Lady Trojans will play Garden City today on Carl Adams Field on campus.

The team will hold the Allen Wolf Memorial Tournament here Saturday and Sunday, April 14 and 15.

Twelve teams will play during the two-day tournament on the city and college fields. Games will begin at 10 a.m. on Saturday and 9 a.m. on Sunday.
