City agrees to help with shed

Beringer asked if that would cover the whole cost and Armstrong said she wasn't sure. Zurcher said he figured it would cost about \$4 or \$5 per square foot and the building's dimensions are 24 feet by 30 feet and 9 feet high, plus a sidewalk.

Armstrong said what the club wants from the council is to see if the way the building would look is acceptable, so Zurcher created a digital image of what the completed building would look like for the council.

Zurcher said the colors would be tan and brown, there would be a 9-foot-by-5-foot garage door on the south side and there would be gutters. He also said there would be a 7/16-inch layer of oriented-strand board

inside the structure to protect the steel shell from punctures.

He said wainscoting, wooden paneling, to line the lower part of walls, so the city can replace the bottom three feet if there is some damage on the side.

Hutfles asked what the city would put in the building, and Armstrong said during the summer, they would probably store a lawnmower and pool-cleaning equipment. During the winter, they would use the building to store pool coverings and chairs.

Councilman Dave Voss asked if they had talked about what it would cost to do some decorative features on the building to make it match the rest of the buildings at the center, and Oren said they hadn't thought that far yet.

Hutfles asked if the club has approached local contractor to get bids, and Oren said they did, and they have a couple of other bids as well.

Beringer then said he thinks they should go forward with the project since the city has the money for it, but Voss suggested that they do it without brick because it would be too expensive.

Armstrong said another thing the club asked for was if the city would help with the of putting electricity in the building, including wiring and fixtures. There was no objection from council members.

Armstrong ended the discussion by saying they would draft an agreement with the club and bring it back to the council at the next meeting.

land, a wish to avenge the death of his father might have been a factor.

A Thursday Facebook update that appeared to have been written by England blamed his father's death on a black man and used a racial slur. The posting said Thursday was the second anniversary of his father's shooting death.

"It's hard not to go off," given

the anniversary and the death of his fiancée earlier this year, the posting said.

"It's apparent from the posting on the Facebook page that he had an ax to grind, and that was possibly part of the motive," Willingham said. "If you read the Facebook post and see what he's accused of doing, you can see there's link between the two of them."

A family friend, Susan Sev-enstar, told the Associated Press

that England was "a good kid" and "a good, hard worker," who "was not in his right mind" after losing his father and the January suicide of his fiancée, with whom he'd recently had a baby.

"If anybody is trying to say this is a racial situation, they've got things confused," said Seven-star, who described England as Cherokee Indian. "He didn't care what your color was. It wasn't a racist thing."

The Tulsa World reported that

England's father, Carl, was shot in the chest during a scuffle with a man who tried to break into his daughter's apartment.

Corey said her decision to skip the grand jury shouldn't be considered a factor in determining whether charges will be filed against George Zimmerman, the neighborhood watch volunteer who has admitted to fatally shooting the unarmed Martin.

The announcement means the decision on charges now rests solely with Corey, who had a reputation for not presenting cases before grand juries if it wasn't required. Under Florida law, only first-degree murder cases require grand juries.

the five protective factors that Center for the Study of Social Policy research has proven to decrease child abuse and neglect and strengthen families," she said.

Campbell said the factors in-

clude parental resilience, social connections, concrete support in times of need, knowledge of parenting and child development and social and emotional competence of children.

Campbell said child abuse affects kids of all ages, races and income levels and often comes

in the home from a person the child knows and trusts. There are four major types of child maltreatment, she said: neglect, and physical, sexual and emotional abuse.

Kansas requires professionals working with children to report child abuse and neglect, she

added. Anyone can report abuse online by going to the website www.srs.ks.gov/agency/ees/Pages/KIPWebintake.aspx or by calling (800) 922-5330.
