With all the different types of soils, from sandy to heavy clays, it's not easy to determine the quality of any given soil without a laboratory analysis.

However, one almost universally good sign of a healthy soil can be easily seen with just a little digging – an abundant population of earthworms, said Peter Tomlinson, K-State Research and Extension environmental quality specialist.

"The beneficial effects of earthworms on soil's physical, chemical and biological properties," Tomlinson said, "have been observed for a long time.... For example,
