Two ceremonies at university accommodate larger class sizes

With class sizes up, Fort Hays State University will have separate ceremonies for graduate and undergraduate students.

Students receiving advanced degrees will participate in commencement at 7 p.m. next Friday in Gross Memorial Coliseum, immediately adjacent to the U.S. 183 Bypass on the south side of the campus. Students receiving associate and bachelor's degrees will participate in commencement at 10 a.m. Saturday, May 12, also in the coliseum.

Graduates of the Kansas Academy of Mathematics and Science will have their own commencement at 3 p.m. Saturday in the Memorial Union Ballroom.

Fort Hays has more than doubled its enrollment over the past decade, and there has been a cor-

responding explosion in the number of graduates. The Registrar's Office projects 3,151 graduates this year, including associate, bachelor and graduate-level degrees. An all-time record, it is the first time the number has exceeded 3,000. The degrees will go to students who completed requirements in summer 2011, fall 2011 and spring 2012.

Doors will open at the coliseum at 8 a.m. Saturday, May 12. Everyone is encouraged to arrive early.

All the ceremonies are free. No tickets are required.

Both the Friday night and the Saturday morning commencements will be broadcast live by the Fort Hays student TV station, KFHS; on Eagle Communication cable channels; and to other communities in western and north central Kansas on the Nex-Tech cable system. In addition, the university will make it available over the Internet at www.fhsu.edu/commencement.
