

Girls win regionals, send six to state meet

The Colby High girls track team took first place in the Class 4A Regional Track Meet on Friday in Buhler, with six girls qualifying for the state meet in Wichita on Friday and Saturday.

The boys team had one member qualify for state.

Seniors Emilea Finley and Paige Roopchan each qualified in three of their four events.

- Finley qualified in the 800 meters, grabbing first with a time of 2 minutes, 20.10 seconds, the 1,600 meters with 5:23.18 and the 3,200 meters with 11:59.75.
- Roopchan qualified in her 100-meter hurdles preliminary race with 17.40 and took fifth in the finals with 17.82. She also got a state spot in the triple jump, taking second with 34' 10.75", and the long jump, scoring fourth with
- Senior Brenna McKee qualified in the long jump, coming in third with a jump of 16 feet, 4.75 inches, and the 400 meters, taking third with 1:02.90.
- Junior Kaitlyn Flanagin qualified in the 100-meter dash preliminaries with 13.00 and took second in the finals with 12.83. She then qualified in the 300-meter hurdles, coming in second with 46.99 sec-

The state meet will be Friday and Saturday at Cessna Stadium at Wichita State University. In the first session Friday, Colby and other Class 4A teams will compete first, with running events beginning at 7:45 a.m. and field events at 8.


