Lady Bulldogs team scores 49 at league meet

The Golden Plains High School girls track team competed at the Western Kansas Liberty League track meet in Scott City, with the girls racking up 49 points.

Macayla Easton and Angela Ritter both placed in the 100-meter run at the meet May 11, with Easton finishing fifth (13.90) and Ritter coming in sixth (14.09). They each placed in the 200-meter run as well, Easton finishing in third

(28.4) and Ritter sixth (29.81).

In the 400-meter run, Easton again finished third (1:03.78) and Ritter placed fourth (1:06.69). In the 800-meter run, Leea Juene-mann finished in fifth place with a time of 2:47.37 and Brooke Wark placed sixth with a season-best time of 2:49.25.

The 4x100-meter relay team of Hannah Antholz, Viridiana Beltran, Ritter and Easton finished with a time of 56.19 seconds for fifth place. The 4x400-meter relay team placed third (5:01.77) with Beltran, Wark, Ana Bermudez and

Juene-mann running. The team of Bermudez, Rebecca Bange, Wark and Juene-mann took second in the 4x800-meter relay with 11:58.53.

Several girls placed well in the finals of the field events. Hailee Spreser took fifth in shot put (29'3.5"), third in discus (93'7") and sixth in javelin (85'2"). Hannah Antholz placed sixth in discus with a throw of 84'7".

The girls had an opportunity to improve their skills and vie for a place in the state meet as they competed in the regional meet at Hays on May 18.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) – NCAA president Mark Emmert believes another round of conference realignment could be sparked by schools trying to position themselves to play in a proposed four-team college football playoff.

Emmert spoke on a variety of

issues during a stop at the Big 12's annual meeting Thursday, including the growing gulf between "haves" and "have nots," the loopholes that exist for student-athletes to transfer, and the concussion epidemic in all level of sports.

Still, it was college football's

postseason that dominated discussions.

While a four-team playoff is being worked on by college football officials, how the teams are picked and how a new format affects the rest of the postseason is still to be determined.
