Donald W. Bouts

Donald W. Bouts, 86, Colby, died Tuesday, May 22, 2012, at the Deseret Health Care Center in Colby.

He was born Aug. 22, 1925, in Jennings, the son of Anton and Leona Bouts. He attended country schools. Graduating from Jennings High School in 1942, he joined his parents, who had moved to Los Angeles, and waited for his 18th birthday, when he enlisted in the Army Air Corps. While in the military, he went to England from the base at Kearney, Neb., and served as a tail gunner on a B-17.

Following the war, he married Barbara Henigar on Oct. 18, 1947, in Los Angeles. They moved to

the family farm south of Jennings, where they farmed for five years. In 1954, they moved to Denver, where he worked at the United Airlines training center for 36 years, until retiring as a simulator trainer instructor in 1990. In 2002 they moved to Colby.

His parents preceded him in death.

Survivors include his wife, Colby; a son, Will (Grace) Bouts, Oberlin; two daughters, Cathy Bouts, Oberlin; and Judy (Jeff) Burns, Centennial, Colo.; one brother; four sisters; and four grandsons.

No services were planned. Memorials may be sent to the family.

Revealing visit to Nuremburg shows human evil and hope in God

churches, two Lutheran and one Roman Catholic, all of which suffered major damage in the bombing of Nuremburg by the Allies at the end of the war.

One church we visited was St. Sebald Church. The building of the church began in 1230. Until the Protestant Reformation it was a Roman Catholic Church, but during the Reformation it became a Lutheran Church, as it remains. Throughout the church's sanctuary was a display of photos showing a bit of the church's history during World War II. First shown was a Nazi parade with the church spires in the background, then several photos of the church in ruins after the allied bombing of Nuremburg, and finally the process of rebuilding the church after the war.

Another church, Liebfrauenkirche (Church of Our Lady) offered a different kind of memorial to both its past and future hopes. It stands in the central market place in Nuremburg on the place of an old synagogue. The synagogue

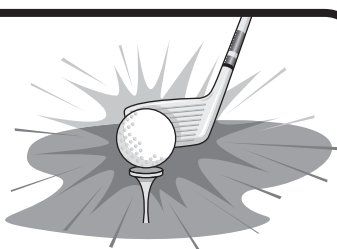
