Security a concern at law center

"This just makes the air heavier and the smell is accelerated," he said. "Heavy humidity also causes mold, and we are constantly cleaning the cells and especially the shower areas."

To help remedy the situation, Taylor said, he bought two dehumidifiers and two air purifiers. Those helped a lot, he said, but did not solve the problem.

During previous meetings, Taylor has pointed out plumbing problems, leaks in the ceiling, too little space for office work, an inmate count that regularly exceeds cell capacity and too few officers on staff.

Taylor said he has been advertising for two new jailers and has not had any applicants yet. Right now, he and his jailers are working 12-hour shifts, the sheriff said, and he anticipates

being down three more people very soon.

He said his office manager has been offered another job and may be leaving soon, although that is not definite. One jailer is on maternity leave and may not return since she has also been offered another job. A second jailer is training to be a road deputy.

Taylor proposed two solutions to the commissioners, and Chairman Ken Christiansen said they'd go through the numbers and see what can be done.

One suggestion is to increase jail wages in hopes this will attract more applicants.

The sheriff said he'd also like to attempt to fill the two existing vacancies, plus hire another employee to work Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

"By law, we are supposed to have a detention officer in

the jail or looking after the jail 24/7," he said. "We do not have that manpower at this time or have had for quite a few years."

Overcrowding been a continual problem, too. To deal with it, the sheriff's department regularly takes inmates to jails in surrounding counties when the jail here exceeds its nine-inmate limit. That adds transportation and other room-and-board costs.

Right now, he said, the county has 13 inmates, including one woman housed in Goodland and three men in Atwood.

Since January, Taylor said, he has attempted to improve conditions in the jail area for staff and inmates.

To help with overcrowding and more sleeping space, three bunk beds have been installed at a cost of about \$2,000, one each in three cells. However, this has

reduced living space during the day, he said.

Ideally, Taylor said, he would like to start sending any inmates over nine to Atwood or Goodland and on Fridays, transport two inmates out so the jail can begin the weekend with seven inmates.

He said arrests usually increase over the weekend and those prisoners must be accommodated. Transporting inmates would be a regular duty if his office could hire another person, he said.

"We understand completely what you are going through," said Christiansen.

Commissioners are also continuing research on either building a new law enforcement center or expanding the current facility, but finding money to pay for that is a major problem.

World stocks extend fall on jobs report

ready strapped for cash and might be overwhelmed by the costs of rescuing its own banks. It might have to tap EU rescue funds, but it is reluctant to do so because such aid would come with conditions on the government's policies.

As worries about Spain's public finances have grown, investors have shied away from lending it money, asking for higher interest rates. Those rates remained high on Monday, at 6.44 percent for 10-year notes, perilously close to the 7 percent that has already

pushed Greece, Ireland and Portugal to seek financial aid.

Meanwhile in Cyprus, the central bank governor said the eurozone member is struggling to find €1.8 billion to inject in its second-largest lender, Cyprus Popular Bank, by a June 30 deadline. That means it is increasingly likely to have to accept EU rescue funds. The chairman of Cyprus Popular Bank also suggested an EU loan now seemed more likely.

Markets came under siege earlier during trading in Asia. Japan's Nikkei 224 index dropped 1.7 percent to close at 8,295.63,

its lowest finish since Nov. 28, 2011. The broader Topix index ended below the 700 mark for the first time since December 1983, Kyodo News Agency said.

Hong Kong's Hang Seng tumbled 2 percent to 18,185.59. South Korea's Kospi shed 2.8 percent to 1,783.13. Benchmarks in Taiwan and Indonesia fell 3 percent and 4.3 percent, respectively.

Mainland Chinese shares also lost ground, with the benchmark Shanghai Composite Index falling 2.7 percent to 2,308.55. The index's drop of 64.89 points was the biggest this year.

meetings for two years.

Then, along with another couple, he and JaNae planted a new church in Chappell where he served as the outreach pastor in charge of worship, youth programs and occasional preaching.

During this time, he received his license through the Berean Fellowship of Churches and made a connection with Mark Carlton, pastor of the Berean Church in Colby.

"When the position for youth and worship pastor opened here at the church, Pastor Mark asked me to send a resume," said Phillips. "God really made it clear that we were supposed to pursue this job.... So we sold the house immediately, securing in our hearts and minds that God was wanting us here.... And within three months, we were moved to Colby."

Phillips said he gets much of his inspiration from his father, who is a pastor in Haxtun. Pastor Carlton also gives insight, he

said, and is a source for guidance.

In addition to leading worship and guiding youth programs, Phillips also undertakes many of the musical responsibilities at the church.

"The music part of my job involves more than just playing tunes," he said. "I am there to lead people in worship through music, teach people what it means to worship God and how to use our gifts and abilities to glorify Him."

Phillips encourages people

to attend services at the church, 1000 S. Franklin Ave. Worship is at 10:45 a.m., and Sunday school for adults, teens and kids is at 9:30 a.m.

High schoolers can attend youth group at 7 p.m. on Sunday nights at the Attic, 1125 S. Franklin Ave. Middle schoolers meet at the same time and place on Wednesdays.

Kansas courts see a slew of high-profile suits pour in

torney General Derek Schmidt said.

Schmidt, a former Republican state senator, said the issues are gaining more public attention because of the political backdrop in which the cases are being heard.

While some of it is timing, some of the challenges are reflective of the change in administration from Democrat to Republican and the political ideology shifting more conservative in the Statehouse, said House Minority Leader Paul Davis.

"I think people sitting in their living rooms are probably scratching their heads. They have seen more combativeness coming out of Topeka than they have in the past," said Davis, a Lawrence Democrat and attorney. "They aren't people who are generally used to that and don't like it. We're not other states where they eat that up. Fighting is not in the nature of Kansas."

House Speaker Mike O'Neal said while redistricting comes up every 10 years and is subject to court review, he is disappointed that other matters have ended up in the

courts. There needs to be a balance between the judicial and legislative branches, and people should not turn to the courts just because legislators didn't provide the outcome they prefer, he said.

The attorney general's office is involved in hundreds of civil lawsuits at any given time at a cost that can run into the millions of dollars.

Schmidt didn't have a firm figure on what the latest round of cases would cost, but suggested it would be expensive.
