





# 'Fantasy' breaks designers' rules

"Fantasy niture" is a term used to describe tables and chairs that don't fit the rules of any recognized style.

Chairs made of cow horns or parts of spinning wheels, and tables held up by carved bears or shaped like large hands are "fantasies." A famous and

is made with a carved man's or woman's face, sometimes with flowing hair.

More ambitious designs have the full figure of a person climbing on top of the chair back. The best of the North Wind chairs have a one-piece back made of solid wood. The carving was not an added piece of wood. Inexpensive chairs influenced by the North Wind group were pressedback chairs showing a face or a person. The design was pressed into the wood by a machine, not a raised carving.


A humorous fantasy chair sold recently. The back was carved to look like a beer keg with a pensive man leaning on the top. The chair is 40 1/2 inches high to the top of his hat. The chair, PKTZU WRZDITPA KTJA ME made in the early 1900s, sold for \$885 at a Showtime auction held in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Q: About 33 years ago, I was metal detecting around Lompoc, Calif. #### Famous Hand

Most deals played in the annual world championship receive limited publicity, even though they may have been bid or played exceptionally well. Often, this is because the same result has been achieved at both tables, yielding no gain to either side.

Here is one such deal from the U.S.-Italy match in 1967. When Benito Garozzo and Pietro Forquet were North-South for Italy, they got to four spades as shown. It was a sound contract that ordinarily would have been made, but Forquet ran into a combination of bad luck and very good defense -- and went down one. West (Edgar Kaplan) made the normal lead of

the jack of clubs, and East (Norman Kay) realized that straightforward defense probably would not produce more than three tricks (two clubs and a spade). He therefore overtook the jack of clubs with

the queen and shifted to his singleton jack of diamonds. Declarer won with dummy's queen, led the jack of trumps, which held, and continued with a trump, won by Kay with the ace. Continuing with the plan he had formulated at

the start, Kay now underled his A-K of clubs, Kaplan winning with the ten. Kaplan then returned a diamond, and Kay ruffed to put the contract down one.

This sparkling defense was later duplicated at the second table by the Italian East-West pair, Walter Avarelli and Giorgio Belladonna. They defeated four spades in exactly the same manner, and the deal proved to be a complete washout.
