Gunman dies in standoff

Cox said.  
Alliance lies about 370 miles west Omaha and 190 miles from Denver.  
Alliance Police Chief John Kiss said Gonzales shot Kirk Felker, 43, in an exchange of gunfire during the initial response. Felker had surgery at Box Butte General Hospital and was recovering.  
Later, state Trooper Tim Flick, 37, was shot and wounded, and Alliance Police Officer Matt Shannon, 35, suffered a shrapnel wound.  
Dixie Nelson, director of the Alliance Chamber of Commerce, said she looked out the window of her office across the street from the pharmacy after an employee heard a gunshot Tuesday.  
Nelson said she saw a police officer who had been shot outside the pharmacy. It appeared the shot was fired through the glass on the store's door or window.  
"He was shot in the arm. I could see. Either his upper forearm or bicep area," Nelson said.

and takes away the incentive to refuse the tests. Howe said.  
But critics say it will cost the state hundreds of thousands of dollars in increased court and jail costs and creates the potential for prolonged court challenges.  
The law will make criminals of people who only are suspected of driving under the influence, he said, and it takes away their rights against self-incrimination, to remain silent or to be free from warrantless searches.  
"It doesn't do anything to curb drunk driving or alcohol-related crashes," Norton said. "It only makes it easier to convict people they suspect."  
The constitutional questions have been answered in other states with similar laws, said Bill Lemons, traffic safety resource prosecutor for the Minnesota County Attorneys Association.  
Since Minnesota implemented a refusal law in 1988 and expanded it to include first-time offenders in 1993, the state has seen a dramatic reduction in test refusals after drunk-driving stops, he said.

Secretary of State visits Colby to explain new voter ID law

bring it the polling place."  
However, he said, if a voter doesn't have a photo ID, the law allows people to get a free photo ID before an election, and even if you forget, you can still vote on election day with a provisional ballot.  
Kobach said you then have six or nine days, depending on the county, to go get a free ID and bring it to the county election office to make sure your provisional ballot is counted.  
"The law really does accommodate anyone whose in that tiny sliver of the population who really might not have a photo ID," he said.  
Kobach said electronic poll books, which Thomas County will have, help make the process faster and easier. These computer systems have a scanner attached to them, he said, that can scan in a voter's driver's license and the voter's information automatically appears on the screen.  
Bryant went over the other acceptable types of identification cards, which are military ID, a state concealed-carry permit, a passport or an ID issued by a government, accredited college, public assistance agency or Indian tribe.  
A woman asked if it is true these IDs don't need to have an address on them, and he said that is correct.  
Bryant then talked about the exemptions to the law, which include people with religious objection, those on the advance voting list, military and overseas voters and mail-in ballot elections.  
Kobach listed the types of documents voters can use to

prove U.S. citizenship in the future, including a birth certificate, a passport and a nationalization document.  
Kobach said he is trying to get the word out about the law as much as possible before the primary, which is set for Tuesday, Aug. 7. He said county clerks are helping, and Thomas County Deputy Clerk Susan Guill and Assistant Deputy Clerk Ashley Schriener were at the meeting sporting "Got Voter ID" shirts.  
He said his office offers fact sheets, fliers, counter cards and posters available on the official website for the act, gotVoterID.com. The flyers and posters have a box at the bottom where local officials can put their contact information.
