Housing hearing scheduled

The Kansas Housing Resources Corp. will hold a public meeting at 1:30 p.m. Monday in the Little Theatre of the Colby Community Building to give citizens a chance to comment on its plans for rural housing.

The corporation is asking for public comments on efforts to help cities and counties develop moderate-income housing and infrastructure in rural areas. The draft plan, called the Kansas Moderate Income Housing Request for Proposal, outlines eligible applicants and activities, application procedures, grant and loan structuring, award criteria, monitoring and reporting requirements.

The agency says it anticipates releasing about \$2.75 million from the state Housing Trust Fund through the program.

The corporation will accept written comments through Friday, July 13, at MIH RFP, Kansas Housing Resources Corp., 611 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 300, Topeka, Kan. 66603. E-mail comments to Fred Bentley, the corporation's rental housing director, at fbentley@kshousingcorp.org.

The proposal will be refined following the comment period, with the final draft expected by Friday, July 20.




