Hesse raised the issue in trying to get one of his two GOP primary opponents, Dr. Shanti Gandhi of Topeka, removed from the ballot in the 52nd Kansas House District. The same argument was used by John Alcala, a Topeka city council member running as a Democrat in the 57th District who is challenging the listing of his Republican opponent, Aimee Rosenow of Topeka.

Gandhi and Rosenow had filed earlier this year in different districts and were drawn into their current ones.

Hesse argued that such candidates were required to withdraw their original filings and refile in the correct district. He said the secretary of state's office acted arbitrarily.

'What you are doing is picking and choosing candidates for offices," Hesse told Kobach during the board's meeting. "What




