From the Pulpit

Everyone has different learning styles. Certain groups of people are going to have similar styles and may be grouped into one of a few various styles. I think we all possess some ability to learn something from every methodology; we just prefer one or two more. Maybe you are a person who learns best by sitting and listening to people; you may soak it in. However, you may see something and be able to retain the information better than listening. I think a combination of one of those with "doing" will help you grasp the concept all the more. That brings us to this quote by an unknown author, "Tell me and I will forget. Show me and I may remember. Involve me and I will understand." It seems there are so many areas this quote is applicable. For instance, when it comes to being told directions, someone could tell me how to drive from one place to another and I may remember some of it, presuming there are several turns, etc. I may be able to visualize it, to remember it more, if shown on a map. However, I will likely understand it much more after I have driven the route and know what to look for as I drive. Careers are another example. You can go to college and be told many things, but that

doesn't guarantee that you will know how to "do" a job. You can shadow someone for any length of time and see how they respond to various situations, but you are different and may respond differently. You can live and work in a career and be able to understand far more than you were ever told or shown, so to be able to do well at your job. A third example is parenting. Were you one of those that had the "great ideas" before you had kids? "My kids aren't going to act like that" may have been your thoughts; partially because you thought you knew how to handle a child. I was one of those. To some extent that may be true, as I read or heard things on parenting. Following an example, TV or real life, I've learned some other ways of effective parenting. However, actually being in the middle of it, I have learned much more. As each child is different, there are applications to parent-

ing one must apply at various times in various ways. I like this quote when it comes to being involved in their Christian walk. There is only so much one can retain when told about the information pertaining to Christianity. I use a projection system when I preach and teach, in order to help people retain the information a bit more, but still that has a limitation on how much someone will retain. Trying to spur people on to practicing the things they are informed about will allow them to retain much more or making the information that is being told and shown to them stick in an experiential way, also increases retention. As you go through life, do not let yourself be limited by the auditory or the visual, rather go out and do things to grasp the deeper knowledge. Think about your own life. What is your example of gaining more knowledge of experiencing over hearing or seeing? I would love to know.

Police say Utah man was stolen goods hoarder

OGDEN, Utah (AP) — It's no crime to be a hoarder, but police say larceny drove an Ogden-area man's need for possession that included stealing vehicles for spare parts to fix other stolen vehicles. Now multiple law enforcement agencies are stacking theft and burglary charges on Brian Michael Davidson, who says everything down to the six weed whackers and 20 laptop batteries police say they confiscated from his home rightfully belongs to him. Police say Davidson also stole a roomful of furnishings from a hotel after his eviction for nonpayment. "He may have some kind of disorder. He steals

things he's already got in multiples," Weber County sheriff's Det. Justin Kelley told the Standard-Examiner of Ogden. "Just really odd." Authorities recovered nine vehicles, two motorcycles and a backhoe. "It's the most baffling thing I've seen in law enforcement," said Brandon Noble of the state Motor Vehicle Enforcement Division. "He steals a whole truck just to replace the bumper on another of his stolen trucks." Noble added, "He said he was doing construction jobs freelance, mostly demolitions, with his \$25,000 backhoe. The backhoe is also stolen."

Beef alliance to meet in July

Two of the world's top beef breed associations are bringing together their collective expertise for the 2012 Beef Profit Alliance. Sunday through Tuesday, July 22 to 24, at Kansas State University. Combined, the Red Angus Association of America and the American Simmental Association have a multi-breed database of more than 9 million animals, including thousands of sires. That collective knowledge will be the focus of this year's national meeting at K-State. The program includes university and industry professionals in breeding, veterinary medicine, meat science, cow-calf production, seed stock production, animal health and more. Registration costs \$85, which includes two meals and transportation to an "Evening in the Flint Hills" on Monday, July 23.
