As I review recent research I look for information I think you will find interesting and/or helpful. Below is information that I found interesting and hope you do too.

Free obesity counseling. Medicare now covers free weight-loss screening and counseling for obese patients for up to one year with no co-pay or deductible.


Here's how the program works. You get one weekly visit for intense behavioral therapy with your primary care provider for the first month. Over the next five months, you meet with your provider for continued counseling twice a month. But if you want to take advantage of a full year's worth of counseling, there's a catch: You must loose 6.6 pounds by the end of the first six months to be eligible to continue counseling for the rest of the year. Tylenol precautions. People who take more than the recommended dosage of Tylenol and other acetaminophen products over as little as just a few days are setting themselves up for fatal liver damage, says U.K. researchers. Acetaminophen builds up in the body, causing an overdose that can be more deadly than taking a single, intentional overdose.

Berkeley Wellness Letter) Nutrition and cataract prevention. Cataracts affect over 20 million Americans age 40 and older. By age 80, more than half of all Americans will have a cataract. While aging is a primary factor for cataracts, other factors also play a role, including exposure to sun and nutrition.

A recent study found people who had low levels of vitamin C in the blood had higher rates of developing cataracts. Super sources of vitamin C include citrus fruits such as oranges. But, there are also many other fruits and vegetables which are excellent sources of vitamin C. These include peppers, broccoli, sweet potatoes, carrots, melons, strawberries, tomatoes and winter squash.

To get a better night's sleep, exercise regularly. In a national survey, people who met federal exercise guidelines - at least 150 minutes of moderate activity or 90 minutes of vigorous activity a week – were much less likely to report poor sleep and daytime sleepiness than those exercising

State gets settlement

More than \$560,000 in workers compensation insurance settlement money paid recently to the Kansas Insurance Department will be deposited into the state's general fund, Sandy Praeger, Commissioner of Insurance, announced

The settlement money comes from AIG, the national financial services company, as a result of a multi-state market conduct examination. The examination by state regulators focused on allegations that the company underreported its workers compensation insurance revenues.

By Kansas law, insurance settlement money is regularly returned to the state general fund.

"Underreporting of premium revenues allowed AIG to pay less in taxes," said Commissioner to us at 462-3963. Praeger. "And since workers comp premiums are taxed at a higher rate than auto, liability and other types of insurance, the company gained an unfair competitive advantage."

pany practices regarding treatment of policyholders, the way premium rates are charged and the way the insurer handles claims. The investigation began in 2008. The Kansas Insurance Depart-

ment, a fee-funded agency, contributed nearly \$143 million to the state general fund last year from premium fees and taxes paid by insurance companies. The department's annual operating budget also comes from insurance company fees and taxes, not the state general fund.
