**2012-2013 BUDGET**



ITHACA, Mich. (AP) – A central Michigan man who couldn’t keep his hands off a piggy bank has been sentenced to four months in jail.  
Adam Spence of Ithaca was sentenced Monday in Gratiot County court. The *Morning Sun* (bit.ly/OefuLI) says he was accused of stealing about \$450


while visiting a baby sitter.  
The bank has a label that says, “My very first piggy bank.” Gratiot County Prosecutor Keith Kushion says the 26-year-old Spence also must write a letter of apology.
