Can you ‘kill’ your septic tank?

Dear Heloise: Recently, you had an excellent segment for septic-tank users in your column.

When we had a new septic tank installed several years ago, the installer cautioned us that excessive use of household antibacterial cleaning products can “kill” a septic tank.

There are times when the use of antibacterial cleaning products is desirable. Most often, just plain soap and water are sufficient for daily cleaning jobs. — Barbara in Iowa

Barbara, household antibacterial products may kill some of the bacteria in a septic system, but it depends on how you use the products. Normal daily use in a household of two to three people probably is all right. Using too much of any product that kills bacteria is what can cause problems. It’s advisable to be mindful of this when cleaning and doing dishes, as well as laundry. — Heloise

Dear Heloise: I know that a lot of people like to wrap their toiletries in plastic bags before putting them in their luggage to contain spills. I cut a small section of plastic wrap, place it over the opening of a container and then screw the lid back on. LIPSTICK COLOR

Dear Readers: A recent column asked how many lipsticks women have. The number ranged from one to more than 90! Here are some hints for using lip color:

- Make sure your lips are fully moisturized. If they are dry, put on a light layer of colorless lip balm or petroleum jelly to keep them soft.
- Next, outline with a lip pencil and fill in with lip liner. (This is what I do.)
- Put on a coat of matte lipstick.
- Fold a tissue in half, place it in between your lips and lightly press them together to blot.
- For a bit of shine, add a dab of lip gloss.

1. You are declarer with the West hand at Four Hearts, and North leads the king of diamonds. Trumps are divided 2-2. How would you play the hand?

WEST
♠ K 9
♥ A K J 7 3
♦ 7 4 2
♣ A 9 5

EAST
♠ 8 7 4
♥ Q 10 9 2
♦ A 6
♣ K J 10 3

2. You are declarer with the West hand at Three Notrump. North leads the queen of hearts, which you duck, and continues with the jack, which you win, South following suit. When you next lead the king of spades, South takes the ace and returns a spade to your queen. How would you continue?

WEST
♠ K Q J
♥ A K 7 4
♦ A K J
♣ K 9 3

EAST
♠ 10 7 4
♥ 6 5 2
♦ 9 4 3 2
♣ A 6 5

Test Your Play

1. The obvious danger is that North has the ace of spades and that you may misguess which way to take the club finesse. Thus, suppose you won the diamond lead, drew trumps and lost a club to South’s queen. He could then return a spade, which would defeat the contract if North had the spade ace. Similarly, if you took the club finesse the other way and lost the trick to North’s queen, you could go down if North then returned a low diamond to South for the killing spade shift.

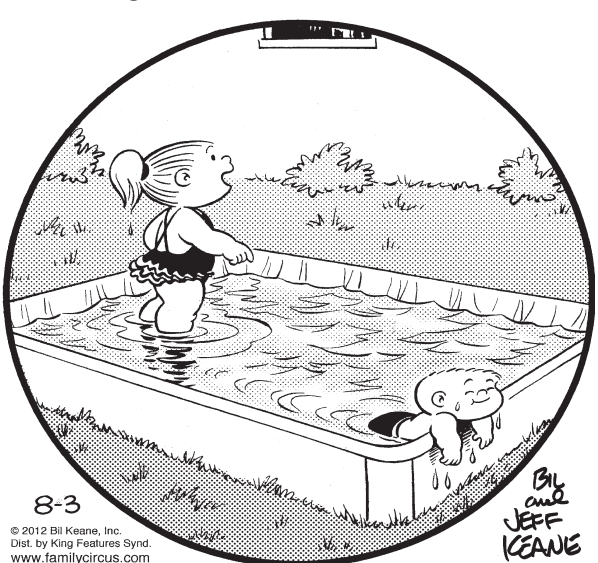
To cover all contingencies, the proper play is to duck the king of diamonds at trick one, thereby severing the North-South communication in that suit. Let’s say North continues with another diamond. You win with the ace, draw trumps, lead the jack of clubs from dummy and finesse. Even if the finesse loses, you are home with 10 tricks consisting of five hearts, the ace of diamonds, three clubs and a diamond ruff in dummy.

2. You have eight sure tricks and so must try to develop a ninth. The question at this point is which is better: to cross to dummy with a club and take a diamond finesse, or to play the A-K-J of diamonds, hoping the suit divides 3-3 or that either opponent started with the singleton or doubleton queen or ten.

The finesse offers about an even chance of success, while playing the A-K-J of diamonds from your hand will succeed in developing an extra trick about two-thirds of the time. Leading the A-K-J is therefore the superior play.
