Belarus shot putter stripped of medal

LONDON (AP) - Shot putlarus became the first athlete to be Olympics after her gold was withdrawn Monday for doping.

Valerie Adams of New Zealand was awarded the gold and Evgeniia Kolodko of Russia was bumped up to silver. Fourth-place finisher Gong Lijiao of China was moved up to bronze.

The International Olympic Committee said Ostapchuk tested positive for the steroid metenolone. She won the shot put exactly a week earlier. The committee said she was tested the day before her competition and again following the event. Both were positive.

"The (Olympic committee) of Belarus is ordered to return to the committee, as soon as possible, the medal, diploma and medallist pin awarded to the athlete in relation to the above-noted event," the IOC said in a statement.
