To bid two spades, or double for takeout, would
therefore be very dangerous and could therefore be very dangerous and could cost you
upward of 500 points if you are doubled for penalties. It is true that you had what seemed to be
a fairly good hand when you first looked at it, but it's been shot to pieces by the enemy bidding.
You can't afford to turn a deaf ear to the values East-West have told you they have.
2. Double. The same sentiments apply here
also, but the difference is that this time you have also, but the difference is that this time you have
good distributional values in addition to your high cards. There is a real possibility of con-
peting successfully against the opponents, eve peting successfully against the opponents, even
though you know they heavily outnumber you in high-card strength.
For example, partner might have something
like $\quad$ O9852 $9653 \leqslant 103 \uparrow 42$, in which case four spades, down one or two, presumably
doubled, would be a much better result than letting the enemy bid and make four hearts.
3. Four spades. You dent
3. Four spades. You don't expect to make four
spades, though you might if you get lucky. The real purpose of the four-spade bid is to steal the opponents' bidding space so they can't find out
exactly what they have between them at a lower level. Occasionally this strategy will pay excellent dividends w

4. Pass. Here, as in the first hand, you take your medicine and pass. The 15 high-card points you
started with have shrunk considerably in value. Your K-J of hearts in front of the heart bidder are worth much less than they were before the bidding started, and the same can be said about the point would be both dangerous and unrealistic.
