Queen City Jazz Band

Jazz band from Denver will play at concert in Goodland

Dixieland jazz, New Orleans jazz, traditional jazz, classic jazz – whatever you call it, the Queen City Jazz Band from Denver has it.

Start the Western Plains Arts Association season out right by attending this opening concert at 3 p.m. (Central Time) Sunday, Sept. 16, in the Goodland High School Auditorium.

For over 50 years, the band has been delighting everyone with the happy sounds of the '20s, '30s and '40s. They have performed at every major Dixieland/swing jazz festival in North America.

Trumpet, trombone, clarinet,

tenor sax, piano, banjo, drums and tuba – each is played by an experienced pro as they bring to life the music of Louis Armstrong, Fats Waller, Jelly Roll Morton, Scott Joplin, Bix Beiderbecke, Wilbur DeParis and Turk Murphy. Their vocalist, Wende Harston, recreates the hit songs of Bessie Smith, Ma Rainey and many other early blues singers. Wende's gospel style is inspiring.

Over the past 50 years the band has produced more than 25 recordings, including four videos. The jazz band has played in the Caribbean, Holland and Switzerland, and performed at dozens of

jazz festivals in North America. The band travels frequently in Colorado and adjoining states to play formal concerts, parties, and church services. In the Denver area they attract large audiences for concerts, including their own annual anniversary bash.

The jazz band has become a Colorado musical institution and has been honored by the state legislature, two governors, two mayors, and the Denver City Council.

Admission is by season ticket or at the door, adults, \$20, students through, \$10. Season tickets can be bought at the concert.
