have been able to help Alisa through her treatments and what to expect,” said Finley. “Robert has a brain tumor and Shania has battled ovarian cancer.
“At first, we thought Alisa was getting the sinus crud that was going around Colby about six or seven months ago. She was on antibiotics for a sinus infection, but when she lost peripheral vision in her right eye, Tina Jallow (a nurse practitioner at Citizens Medical Center) got concerned and ordered a CT scan. She is a godsend and has looked after our family.
“Alisa’s first surgery was on Aug. 2 and

her second was Aug. 18. They removed about 90 percent and got more than they thought they’d be able to, since it is deep in the middle of her brain.”
Already dealing with nerves of a move and being a new student, Alisa has shown courage and bravery most kids her age would never dream of. Her positive attitude and strong voice is heard, even 230 miles away from home in the sterile halls of the Children’s Hospital in Denver.
“I’ve learned to not give up,” she said, “and I don’t know what I’d do without my family.”
“Alisa is a very strong, upbeat person,” said Finley-Shanahan. “She is kind-hearted

and nice to everyone and is a wonderful aunt of two nieces and two nephews.”
Alisa and her family moved here a year ago from Colorado. Her dad is a native of Brewster.
She is the middle child of six and has three brothers and two sisters: Michael, 27; Shania, 25; Christa, 23; Ramzy, 13; and Terance, 11.
Although Alisa and her family are new to Colby, her mother says they’ve received tremendous support from people here already and she hopes Finley-Shanahan’s efforts for Saturday are met with a big attendance.

Candidates trade words over attacks

it with a black banner bearing Islam’s declaration of faith – “There is no God but Allah.”
Those protests followed attacks first in Egypt, where scuffles persisted today between police and protesters near the U.S. Embassy in Cairo. They then spread to Libya, leading to the death of American Ambassador Chris Stevens and three other Americans at the U.S. consulate.
The Obama administration is dispatching two warships to the Libyan coast, ready to respond to any mission ordered by the

president, who vowed Wednesday that “justice will be done.”
Romney responded by criticizing Obama for having “a hit-or-miss approach” on foreign policy and tried to blame the president for an early statement from the embassy in Cairo that criticized the film as protests were forming.
Romney incorrectly said the statement came after the embassy’s grounds had been breached and added that the president is responsible for the words that come from his diplomats around the world.
“They clearly sent mixed messages to the world,” Romney

told reporters while campaigning Wednesday in Florida. “The statement that came from the administration was a statement which is akin to an apology and I think was a severe miscalculation.”
Obama responded to his rival in an interview with CBS News’ “60 Minutes” later in the day. “It appears that Gov. Romney didn’t have his facts right,” Obama said. He added that as president “it’s important for you to make sure that the statements you make are backed up by the facts, and that you’ve thought through the ramifications before you make them.”
Congressional Democrats spoke in sync with the president and accused Romney of mishandling international affairs and trying to politicize a tragedy. Republicans were less unified – some questioned Romney’s handling of national security measures and top GOP leaders in Congress did not echo his criticisms of the president. Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell of Kentucky said Obama “correctly tightened the security overseas.”
Asked about Romney’s remarks, he declined to answer and walked toward his office in the Capitol.

Beef company sues ABC News for ‘pink slime’ defamation

Carl Custer, a former federal food scientist, and Kit Foshee, a former company quality assurance manager who was interviewed by ABC.
The “defendants engaged in a monthlong vicious, concerted disinformation campaign against BPI,” the lawsuit claims.
The reports cited in the lawsuit

include 11 that aired on television and 14 that appeared online between March 7 and April 3.
Webb said the reports had “an enormous impact” on the company, forcing it to close three of its four U.S. plants and lay off more than 650 workers. Webb said the network also published a list of chain grocery stores that had stopped selling the product, and that this pressured others to

end their business relationship with the company.
Craig Letch, the company’s director of food-quality assurance, said the company lost 80 percent of its business in 28 days. Some of the customers have returned, he said, but it still doesn’t have the customer base that would allow it to rehire former employees.
Webb said the reports created

the false impression “that it’s some type of chemical product, that it’s not beef. It led people to believe that it’s some kind of repulsive, horrible, vile substance that got put into ground beef and hidden from consumers.”
The company has previously declined to discuss how much it lost in sales, but acknowledged it took a “substantial” hit.
Critics worried about the way

the meat is processed. Bits of beef are heated and treated with a small amount of ammonia to kill bacteria, a practice that has been used for decades and meets federal food safety standards.
The phrase “pink slime” began to spread after *The New York Times* cited it in a 2009 article on the safety of meat processing methods.
