Mobile idea shower helps North Dakota teen towards college

ALEXANDER, N.D. (AP) -It took little more than a day for 18-year-old Evan Jensen to smell opportunity in North Dakota's booming oil patch.

The recent high school graduate got a whiff of himself and his 21-year-old brother, Justin. The two had been sleeping in a pickup while looking for work in the oil fields of North Dakota.

"We smelled," he said. "Bad." Thousands of workers have a shower and brush your teeth."

descended on the region to seek their fortune in the oil fields, and housing construction and growth of brick-and-mortar businesses haven't kept up. The closest shower to Jensen was at a truck stop some 60 miles away.

That's when the idea for a mobile shower hit him harder than the reek of his own B.O. The money he's made from it could help him get to college.

"There are a lot of necessities that aren't available out here," Jensen said. "Like a place to take

An armada of food trucks and other roving enterprises was already catering to oilfield workers. The teen believed others also would value a hot shower nearly as much as a hot meal.

He pitched the idea to his parents back at their farm near Lake Preston in eastern South Dakota. His father and other relatives helped him convert a 53-foot semitrailer into a five-stall shower center with an office and laundry facilities.

A 6,000-gallon semi tanker alongside the trailer provides fresh water and collects the greywater.

ter Showers, rolled into an RV campground in the heart of the oil patch in June. A shower costs \$10, with a half-price discount for residents of the RV park where the business is located. Towels and washcloths are \$1 extra. The water pressure is strong, the soap is free and there is no time limit.

The business is parked along U.S. Highway 85, the busiest twolane highway in western North Dakota, where about 100 trucks pass by every 10 minutes. The showers are open from 4 p.m. to
