ORDINANCE INCORPORATING THE STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE BY REFERENCE

ORDINANCE NO. 310

An ordinance regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Brewster, Kansas; incorporating by reference the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," edition of 2012; with certain omissions, changes and additions; prescribing additional regulations; providing certain penalties and repealing ordinance numbered 308.

Be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Brewster, Kansas:

Section 1. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Brewster, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2012, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, save and except such articles, sections, parts or portions as are hereafter omitted, deleted, modified or changed. No fewer than three copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 310," with all sections or portions thereof intended to be omitted or changed clearly marked to show any such omission or change and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the city clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the city charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the city, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

Section 2. OMITTING PROVISIONS. Sections 114.1, 114.2, 114.4 and 114.5 of said Standard Traffic Ordinance relating to the unlawful operation of All-Terrain Vehicles, Micro Utility Trucks, Golf Carts and Work-Site Utility Vehicles is hereby declared to be and is omitted and deleted.

Section 3. CHANGING PROVISIONS. Section 33 (a) of said Standard Traffic ordinance is hereby changed to read as follows: Except as provided in subsection (b) and except when a special hazard exists that requires lower speed for compliance with K.S.A. 8-1557, and amendments thereto, the limits specified in this subsection or established as authorized

Section 4. TRAFFIC INFRACTIONS AND TRAFFIC OFFENSES. An ordinance traffic infraction is a violation of any section of this ordinance that prescribes or requires the same behavior as that prescribed or required by a statutory provision that is classified as a traffic infraction in K.S.A. 8-2118.

All traffic violations which are included within this ordinance, and which are not ordinance traffic infractions, as defined in subsection (a) of this section, shall be considered traffic offenses.

Section 5. PENALTY FOR SCHEDULED FINES. The fine for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or any other traffic offense for which the municipal judge establishes a fine in a fine schedule shall not be less than \$10.00 nor more than \$500.00, except for speeding which shall not be less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00. A person tried and convicted for violation of an ordinance traffic infraction or other traffic offense for which a fine has been established in a schedule of fines shall pay a fine fixed by the court not to exceed \$500.00.

Section 6. REPEAL. Ordinance No. 308 is repealed.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

Iconic racing car sold after sitting atop auto glass store for last 50 years

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) – A roadster that finished second in the 1956 Indianapolis 500 before spending the past 50 years atop a business, becoming an iconic landmark, has been sold.

The race car, which has been at Safety Auto Glass since 1961, will be taken down Tuesday to undergo extensive renovation. *The Indianapolis Star* reported (indy.st/QtyHuN). Gary Schroeder of Burbank, Calif., one of the purchasers, says the renovation work is expected to take several years.

Auto historian Donald Davidson said being perched atop a business did seem like a sad place for such "a glorious racing car."

"But it became such a landmark, such a talking point. I myself sometimes detoured past it

just to see that it was still there," he said.

The race car was built in 1954 by Kurtis Kraft and driven briefly by Bill Vukovich, the two-time 500 winner who some consider the greatest driver at Indianapolis. Another highly regarded driver, Sam Hanks, the 1957 winner, drove the car in the 1955 and 1956 races.

His widow, Alice Hanks, said in an e-mail from her home in Pacific Palisades, Calif., that her husband was never happy about the car being on the roof.

"Sam had a lot of sentiment about some of the cars he drove, especially the ones he did well in. Sam said that 1956 was one of the hardest races he ever drove," she said.

Safety Auto Glass President

Steve Perkins and the two buyers, Schroeder and Indianapolis resident Chris Paulsen, would not disclose the sale price. Perkins said in 2004, he had turned down an offer of \$20,000 for the car.

Several fully restored cars have sold in the \$200,000 range in recent years, Davidson said.

Perkins has batted away "40 or 50 offers" to buy the oddly positioned car since taking over the business started by his father, who died in 1991.

"But now it's just time," he said. "It's the right thing to do and these are the right people."

Paulsen and Schroeder plan to take the roadster to car shows and take turns driving it in vintage car races.
