For the boys varsity, two boys received medals: sophomore Alec Onstad finished fifth with 18:59 and senior John Faber took sixth with 19:03.

"Alec Onstad finished strong for us in fifth place and he continues to become more consistent in his efforts throughout the race," Giersch said.

Other runners for the varsity boys were sophomore Aaron Faber, who came in 18th with 19:59; junior Michael Schiferl 22nd with 20:21; senior Wiatt Binder 37th with 21:04; junior Marc Bremenkamp 40th with 21:28; and senior Brad Schroeder 42nd with 21:44.

The Eagles received team medals in both divisions for varsity.

The boys junior varsity squad had three individual medalists: senior Blake McNinch third with 21:31, senior Brady Rose fourth with 21:37 and senior Matt Dickman ninth with 22:30.

"As a team, the JV boys ran very well also," Giersch said. "We had 22 runners in this meet and 17 of the 22 runners came home with a medal."


