day, Feb. 14, to decide which company they want to use.

That decision will take effect the first day of the month after they decide and will stay in effect for the rest of the year.

Whether a client keeps their same doctor or other health care providers will depend on whether that provider is covered by the patient's chosen plan, they said.

In response to a question about what to do if a doctor is not covered under a new plan, LaVerta Greve, who also works for the health department, said the state has "challenged the managed care organizations" to provide clients with the doctors they want. "Let your MCO know and they will re-

ally work to get the provider that's not in it into your network," she said. If that does not work, she added, "They will work to get a provider that's in your plan to serve your One big change brought by KanCare will

be the presence of coordinators who will help clients decide where they get their

The state will assess each patient and as-

sign coordinators to clients with especially working with one of the managed care compressing or complex needs, Swanson said. Clients with the most needs will be placed with a "health home," a network of providers who work with the coordinators.
