Jasper said there are many reasons why she hopes people will participate.

"It's amazing how many people are affected by this cancer, or any form of cancer," she said. "It seems uncommon for people to not know a fighter, survivor or someone who has been taken by cancer. I know a handful of survivors and cannot fathom the fight they went through and still go through."

"I guess as a woman, this cancer is more close to my heart. Cancer just sneaks up on people. I

think if we have an opportunity to promote awareness, or more importantly, help those who are fighting this disease with some financial support, than we are better for that.

"I hope our community is able to do just that and come out on the 21st. The pinker the better."

Sept. 11 case back before Guantanamo crimes court

happened to Mohammed and his co-defendants during several years of CIA confinement and interrogation.

The protective order requires the court to use a 40-second delay during court proceedings so that spectators, who watch behind sound-proof glass, can be prevented from hearing — from officials, lawyers or the defendants themselves — the still-classified details of the CIA's rendition and detention program.

The order, which is also being challenged by a coalition of media organizations that includes

the Associated Press, is overly broad because it would "classify the defendants' own knowledge, thoughts and experience," Shamsi said in an interview.

"It's a truly extraordinary and chilling proposal that the government is asking the court to accept," she said.

Protective orders are standard method in civilian and military trials to set rules for handling evidence for the prosecution and defense. Military prosecutors argue in court papers that the Sept. 11 trial requires additional security because the accused have personal knowledge of classified information such as interroga-

tion techniques and knowledge about which countries provided assistance in their capture.

"Each of the accused is in the unique position of having had access to classified intelligence sources and methods," the prosecution says in court papers.

Army Brig. Gen. Mark Martins, the chief prosecutor for the military commissions, said Sunday that the security precautions are necessary to prevent the release of information that could harm U.S. intelligence operations or personnel around the world, and not to prevent embarrassing the government or to cover-up wrongdoing.

Scots move closer to independence

ration from Britain would become clear, and that his government envisioned "a Scotland with a new place in the world — as an independent nation."

Cameron did not immediately comment. But the prime minister is expected later to praise Scotland's two governments for coming together to deliver a "legal, fair and decisive" referendum that now puts the decision on a separate Scotland

or a United Kingdom in the people's hands.

"This marks the beginning of an important chapter in Scotland's story and allows the real debate to begin," Cameron will say in a speech later today, according to prepared remarks released by his office.

Cameron and other pro-union politicians had pressed for the vote to be held earlier than 2014, because opinion polls show that only between a quarter and a third of Scots currently favor leaving the union.
