Makayla Hoffman, of Colby, was one of 704 Kansas youth who exhibited 1,453 head of livestock at the show, September 21 to 24 in Wichita. Hoffman's heifer took the reserve champion place for the all other breeds breeding heifer category. Her angus breeding heifer took third place out of six entries in that category.

The show is sponsored by the Kansas Livestock Association, Kansas State University and the Agri-Business Council of Wichita. Competitors came home with auction premiums and scholarships.

Hoffman's was one of 272 head entered into the breeding heifer show. A Limousin female owned by Randee Corns of Eureka was judged supreme champion; a Chianina shown by Lauren Prill from Wichita was the reserve champion.
