

Men's cross country team makes history at nationals

made history on Saturday at the National Junior College Athletic Association Championships in Ina. Ill.

The men, coached by James Ortiz, finished in fourth place the best in school history. The previous best was in 2011 when the team finished ninth.

"We left the meet with mixed emotions," said Ortiz. "Our guys were disappointed because they know we could have finished the 28:09.7. meet with some hardware, and they came really close. Our team is also proud knowing they gave the best teams in the nation a run for their money.'

In addition to the team effort, Nico Barrera, a freshman from Carlsbad, N.M., led the way for the Trojans, finishing in 15th place with a time of 26 minutes, 38.6 seconds. Barrera earned All-American honors in recognition of his efforts.
